2021 has finally arrived. This past year has been, for many of us, one of the most challenging years of our lives. One of the articles I read as I was researching ideas on hope called 2020 a "wretched" year. The author, Kaisha Johnson of The U of I Springfield Journal, went on to say, "While the clock striking

twelve on January 1 does not signal definitive change, it does insinuate the possibility of a fresh start. Some 2020 events have generated the turn of a new leaf, so to speak. If such events are to encourage change in the world, there could be a considerable amount of things to look forward to in the very near future. These events can give anyone just a glimmer of hope for what (is) yet to come."

Last year the Unity Advent booklet, *The Spirit of Christmas*, contemplated both hope **and** faith as the first week's focus, expanding the traditional Christian theme of hope on its own. In the piece written for the first Sunday, November 29, 2020, Rev. Kurt Condra stated that Unity was "perhaps inspired by the view that '*faith* is the assurance of things *hoped* for.' " He then wrote, "In *The Revealing Word* Unity cofounder Charles Fillmore makes this distinction: 'Hope is the expectation of good in the future ... It is subject to time. Faith is the certain knowledge that our good is ours right now ... It goes beyond time and space.' "

As we begin the first month of this new year, I, along with the rest of our Prayer Chaplain Ministry, invite you to hold a glimmer of *hope* for the desires of your heart **and** hold the *faith* that the good you seek is already yours.
