But if we want to ensure a fail-safe joyful Christmas, we can each make this happen for ourselves.

That child in you that once went through Advent in joyous wonder and anticipation of the birth of the Christ is still alive. If he or she is now orphaned, it is because you have abandoned him or her. We can still reach out by reaching in and embrace that glorious miracle. We can sing it out. We can breathe Christmas in every breath, and deliriously await the opening of ourselves. Santa's "Ho Ho Ho's" never were a reaction to what the world is about.

Plan the New Year


