Summer is my favorite season. I love the long days, and the sunshine always lifts me up. I am grateful to walk Rocky wearing a pair of shorts and a t-shirt instead of multiple layers of clothing. I feel free and uninhibited, and it all is accentuated by the 4th of July holiday.

Growing up I never thought about freedom. I took being American for granted. As I matured I learned that the privilege that I had but never thought about did not apply to everyone.

There always were restrictions for all of us. Back then the police had more unwritten power over us. In my neighborhood, there were detectives that often took teenagers into custody and sometimes knocked them around a bit just because they could. There was no remedy for this; even parents accepted it as being within the proper discourse of police authority. My contact with African Americans was virtually nil growing up, but many friends at school and in the neighborhood were brown, and it was just understood that for them less freedom was normal.

We frequently mouthed an expression back then. You could say and do what you want because, "It's a free country." We believed that America was freer than any other country in the world. We still were reaping the benefits of winning our independence from the restrictions that had been imposed by the king of England. Or, so we thought.

As I write this article, I now understand that freedom is not free. If you want it, you have to be willing to pay for it. Furthermore, it is not a one-time payment. It is an ongoing charge like a subscription to Netfix only way more complicated. For example, you can get a couple of months or years at no cost in exchange for the freedom of some other group or class. All you have to do is align yourself with the proper political position at any given time. It seems like a good deal at the time, but in reality you are paying for privileges at the cost of your own freedom. Freedom as a commodity always is at a cost to somebody, and ultimately to everybody.

When our Declaration of Independence was drafted, it was a beacon of freedom that shined brightly casting its light on the entire world. It was not perfect. Some of those "unalienable rights" remained alienable to the likes of women, Blacks and others. It still can serve as a profound ideology if we choose to embrace freedom as a process instead of a bargaining chip. As is the case with the Christ essence that resides deep within us, anytime we choose to trade it or ignore it, we take steps backwards.

This year let us make those fireworks displays a form of prayer, and truly make freedom ring.

Progress in the physical world in which we reside seems to be such a slow process. And the old axiom, "slowly but *surely*," is no longer ringing true these days.

I recently came upon this quote from Michael J. Fox, "Gratitude is what makes hope sustainable." So, although I am sad that it has taken so long, I am grateful we have finally acknowledged this important event in our history. And I am equally grateful that we, as Truth *practice-ers*, hold the key to "keep on keeping on" - prayer and meditation - despite outer circumstances!


