


February 2025

Ministerial Musings



Recently, I had a conversation with an acquaintance about Black History Month. He was arguing against singling out a month to focus on one race while other races did not enjoy such attention. Ironically, he charged that it smirked with inequality. What he failed to understand is that his feelings and stance were precisely why Black History Month is a right and proper awareness for all Americans.

Black history and American history are inseparable. For centuries the plight and progress of African Americans has been at the forefront that has defined what America has been and is today, and this truth is not limited to the institution of slavery. Over 620,000 soldiers died in the American Civil War, a war that has continued to be waged right up to the present day as universal freedom and equality have yet to be agreed upon as God given rights. The South may have surrendered, but racism continues to do battle.

All individuals and institutions have a history. Our pasts definitely influence our present both positively and negatively. Life species that evolve and learn from the pain of the past and are able to bring forth and magnify the love of the past survive and flourish. To express this alternatively, things get better the more life is able to embrace the Presence of God in Itself and eradicate that which is otherwise.

This is all part of a Divine Struggle. It is a struggle that is not limited to the victims, but extends as well to those who victimize. To assert your superiority over another demographic is a self-imposed form of slavery. It is only through a mindset of removing any and all subjugations for all of humanity that we resurrect and ascend in a true sense of our own freedom. This is truly a highly idealistic notion, one that calls on all of us to evolve spiritually as well as physiologically. It requires looking at "different" as something to be honored rather than hated or feared.

This is why Black History Month is potentially is so significant. The ideal expressed here is not going to happen just like so. It will require work, but that work brings hope and promise. The more all races, creeds and nationalities can learn from the victims and heroes who have been a part of the African American journey, the more we inch forward toward who and what we are and the greatness of the gift of life we all share. Black history is so much more than a compartmentalized segment of human history. It is a part of us all.

I find it fitting that February has been chosen as Black History Month. February also is home to Valentine's Day, a day more than any other that celebrates love. Of course, February also includes Groundhog Day. In the spirit of that holiday, we get to decide. Will there be more of what has been, or will we move to warmth and come together to build a New Day?

Prayer Chaplain Ministry

The first month of this new year, 2025, is already history. And so, we move on!

Considering what to write about this month I read through some past newsletters and decided to revisit part of the August 2022 missive, written as we were "coming out of" Covid. Although that was only 2 1/2 years ago, it almost seems like ancient history.



And the future that is now unfolding is no longer a "figment of some people's imagination."

However, the truths quoted in that *long ago* newsletter are as fresh today as when they were written by the authors during the latter part of the 20th century...

As Unity students we know that we are unlimited spiritual beings; that the resources we look to for guidance and support to navigate in this world are within us! For inspiration, here are a few excerpts from the two books that Rev. Mike used in a recent (2022) Welcome to Unity Class. (Both books are currently available on Amazon.)

The first is from Eric Butterworth's *Unity: A Quest for Truth.* "On the human level of appearances, it seems that changes can lead to loss and injustice. But beyond the appearance is a level of experience where God's law of adjustment is always active, turning losses into gain, revealing the truth that even if (it) was intended for evil, God intends it for good... Divine order is always established within and beyond the experience for good." (p. 102)

How can we look beyond the appearances that seem to surround us in this life? If you have read or studied any Unity writings, you might be familiar with this answer - practice prayer and meditation. The book *Alternatives, New Approaches to Traditional Christian Beliefs* by William L. Fisher describes a number of traditional types of prayer, then offers more effective ways to pray. "Real prayer is an entrance into spiritual communion with God. This can only be done when we pray our own heartfelt prayers, when we pray in order to feel a sense of kinship with God... The Apostle Paul instructed us to 'pray constantly." He goes on to say that we don't have to be on our knees or point our folded hands upwards. The position of our body is not important, "but the position of our mind is all-important. We can have a constant *attitude* of prayer." (p. 32)

This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. Psalm 118:24

If you have ever contemplated becoming a prayer chaplain, we invite you to join our **Prayer Chaplain Ministry Training** being held the following two weekends: Friday the 28th of February, & Saturday, March 1st; then Friday March 21st & Saturday March 22nd. Fridays we'll meet from 6 PM to 9PM and Saturdays will be from 8 AM to 5 PM. This training is an opportunity to enrich your spirituality through service to our members. Your decision to be a Prayer Chaplain is not expected until after the training has been completed.

The requirements for applicants are:

- Have a willingness to acknowledge and call on the presence of God;
- Have a willingness to consistently and empathically listen;
- Have a willingness to pray with others;
- Hold all that is shared with you in the strictest of confidence;
- Demonstrate a willingness to stand in faith, trusting in God;
- Show genuine interest and respect for the well-being of all congregants as well as your fellow Prayer Chaplains;
- Be a current active member of Unity of Fox Valley ministry.




