Ministerial Musings

May Day



May Day, sometimes referenced as Mayday, has multiple meanings and connotations. The first of which has ancient origins as a European festival marking the beginning of summer. It usually was celebrated on May 1st. Festivities usually were quite extensive featuring such traditions as gathering wildflowers and green branches, crowning a May Queen, setting up a Maypole and extensive bonfires the night before. All in all it served to elevate awareness to the blessings of new life.

Next is International Workers Day also known as May Day. It commemorates the late 19th-century labor movement and the struggle for workers' rights, particularly the eight-hour workday. It was established in 1889 by the Second International, a socialist organization to honor the Haymarket Affair in Chicago. Unlike Labor Day, due to its origin it has a darker tone attached to it due to the incident in Chicago.



The Haymarket Affair in Chicago was a violent confrontation in Chicago between protesters and police. It resulted in the deaths of both several police and protesters. Eight labor leaders were arrested, tried and convicted despite a lack of evidence linking them to the violence. Four of them were executed, one committed suicide and the other three eventually were pardoned by the governor.

The remaining reference to May Day is to sound an alarm. It takes the form of being sounded three times: "May Day, May Day, May Day!" It basically is an audible SOS



commonly used in both aviation and marine circumstances but not exclusively.

A May Day call may often be sent out via radio but again not exclusively. It modern times it may also be sent out by a mobile phone or even a shout depending upon the emergency situation.

It also can become sustained taking the form of protests in response to perceived threats to human life. Such was the case of the civil rights protests during the civil rights movement in the 60's and 70's as well as the Black Lives Matter movement in more recent years. The protests to the Viet Nam War also might be categorized as a May Day alarm although there is no evidence of that term ever having been used back then. In these instances like all May Day alerts, they are calls to action and are very similar to recent protests in our nation. Are protesters responding to emergencies? Perhaps. To crises? Absolutely.

As radically different as the three May Days may be, they all are calls to action. Ancient festivals are calls not just to recognize but to be grateful and celebrate the gifts of summer and the plush abundance that it brings. May Day honoring the contributions of laborers calls us to be mindful that fairness and appreciation is due to everyone. May Day alerts call us to be responsive and not passive when the need arises. All three contribute to preventing, mitigating and dealing with chaos not only socially but also individually. All three are about "Mind-Fulness" in our multi-faceted lives.
